§ 32.01 SECRETARY/TREASURER.

The offices of Secretary and Treasurer of the borough are hereby combined.

§ 32.02 INDEPENDENT AUDITOR.

The Borough Council is hereby authorized to appoint an independent auditor, according to the criteria set forth in the said State Borough Code, who shall be appointed, annually, by resolution before the close of a fiscal year, to make an independent examination of the accounting records of the borough for such fiscal year, and perform the other duties and exercise the powers conferred by said borough code.

§ 32.03 COMPENSATION OF COUNCIL AND MAYOR.

(A) The borough is hereby authorized to pay to each Council member and to the Mayor a sum per month as set forth in the borough fee schedule, which is adopted by resolution, for the performance of the duties of their office as imposed by law.

(B) The minimum requirement which must be met in order for any said official to qualify for receipt of the monthly compensation shall be the attendance at and participation in the regular meeting of the Borough Council for each month that said compensation is available. The compliance with the above minimum requirement shall not be interpreted as precluding any legally authorized action by Council to withhold or deny compensation to any official who otherwise fails or refuses to perform any other duties imposed or required by law. Any action by Council to withhold or deny compensation, in such cases,

must be authorized by law and shall only occur following ten-days' written notice to the official whose right to receive compensation has been questioned and only following a full hearing or discussion on the merits, with the opportunity for all parties to be heard.

(C) The compensation to be paid to the eligible officials, as set forth above, can be made on a monthly or quarterly basis, as Council shall determine by appropriate resolution from time to time.

(D) This section shall become effective upon enactment by Council and approval of the Mayor, however, each official's eligibility to receive the compensation set forth shall not take effect until permitted by law.
