§ 93.01 DEFINITIONS.

For the purpose of this chapter, the following definitions shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning. As used in this chapter, the singular shall include the plural, the plural shall include the singular, and the masculine shall include the feminine and the neuter.

PUBLIC PROPERTY. Any public park, playground or other public facility in the borough.

REMAIN. To stay behind, to loiter and to stay unnecessarily upon said public property.

§ 93.02 PURPOSES.

This is a chapter prescribing, in accordance with prevailing community standards, regulations for the conduct of individuals in and upon public property, for the protection of younger children in the borough, from each other and from other persons on the streets during nighttime hours, for the enforcement of parental control and responsibility for children, for the protection of the public from nocturnal mischief by minors and for the reduction of the incident of criminal activity, for the public good, safety and welfare.

§ 93.03 HOURS OF USE AND OPERATION.

(A) No individual or groups of individuals shall enter upon or remain on any public property, parks, playgrounds or other borough facilities between the hours of 9:00 p.m and 5:00 a.m., during the months of June, July and August. During the other months of the year, no individual, or groups of individuals, shall be permitted to enter upon or remain on any public property, parks, playgrounds or other borough facilities between the hours of 7:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m.

(B) The above restrictions do not apply to any event or activity taking place on said public facilities, which may be sponsored or approved by Borough Council.

§ 93.04 PROCEDURE UPON VIOLATION.

Any person found upon any public property within the borough in violation of § 93.02 shall be considered to be a trespasser upon said property, and may be taken into custody, and prosecuted. In addition, said person may be made subject to the penalties as set forth in § 93.99.

§ 93.99 PENALTY.

Any person who shall violate any provision of this chapter shall, on conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$600, and in default of payment, to imprisonment for a term not to exceed 30 days.
